Through the initiative, the Alzheimer's Association will form partnerships with health systems in Missouri and Illinois to improve care for individuals living with Alzheimer's and other dementias by coordinating care between healthcare providers, the Alzheimer's Association and people living with dementia and their caregivers.

For Healthcare Providers

- Reduced burden on clinicians by optimizing health care team roles.
- A unified approach for better management of all diseases or conditions in a patient.
- Increased confidence to provide comprehensive assessment, accurate diagnosis and disclosure.
- Improved management of related- and non-related symptoms and behaviors.

For Health Systems:

- Reduce healthcare costs through lower dementia related emergency room visits and hospitalizations.
- DCC model is evidence based, low-cost and easy to implement and replicate.
- Increased access to community; Improved population health with reduced disparities in care.

Under the Knight Family Dementia Care Coordination Initiative,

- We partner with health systems.
- We provide CEU- accredited professional training to the clinical staff and dementia- awareness training for the non-medical staff.
- Partner health providers refer people living with dementia to the Alzheimer's Association.
- Our clinical staff reaches out to caregivers to:
 - Form customized care plans.
 - Provide access to disease education programs and community resources.
 - **Support** them to effectively manage their loved ones' symptoms and behaviors.
- The clinical staff at Alzheimer's Association shares **summary care plan** with the referring provider.

The Alzheimer's Association services also include a **24/7 Helpline**, interactive online tools, support groups, and early stage engagement programs.
